The Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Town of Fairplay was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers located in the Fairplay Town Hall, 901 Main Street, by Mayor Frank Just who proceeded with the pledge of allegiance, followed by the roll call which was answered by Trustees Scott Dodge, Trustee Paul Kemp and Trustee Cindy Bear. Also in attendance were Town Treasurer Kim Wittbrodt, Chief of Police Marcus Woodward, Director of Public Works Jim Brown, Assistant Town Administrator Mason Green and Deputy Clerk Sarah Ernst. CITIZEN COMMENTS

Dr. Fitting provided information about the current CDC recommendations for public safety along with travel restrictions and social distancing. She also explained that to be tested you will need to have a recommendation from your primary care provider. She did state that things are happening very quickly and she will try to keep the Board and Town staff updated with the information gathered at the meetings she is involved in.

Assistant Town Administrator, Mason Green, mentioned that the Town is of the mindset to be prepared and keep all citizens safe.

PRESENTATION

Special Events Coordinator Julie Bullock introduced Josh and Laura Jenson, the owners of Skyline Photography. She explained that the Town has already worked with them on Plein Air 2019 and Mardi Gras 2020 free of charge. Josh and Laura provided a slide show to show some of their pictures and videos taken at these events.

Mayor Just thanked Skyline Photography for their presentation.

Bullock explained that a contract has been signed and she is excited about working with Skyline Photography for future events and publications.

Assistant Town Administrator Green introduced the topic, explaining that the contract's with ChargePoint Inc. for the installation of electrical vehicle charging stations. Green stated that under this agreement ChargePoint Inc. will pay all the costs associated with installing, operating and maintaining the charging stations and also receive any and all profits. The Town is responsible for maintaining the stations to the same extent it maintains the parking lot and letting ChargPoint know if there is any damage to the charging station.

In addition, Green explained that the agreement is for a ten year term and allows the Town to opt out after seven years and each successive year thereafter with a monetary penalty to the Town, which declines each year. This is due to the State of Colorado Alt-Fuels Corridor Grant requirements regarding the type of power supply which is required to be installed.

Green stated that staff recommends approving Resolution No. 10 and Just asked for a motion.

Motion #4 by Trustee Kemp, seconded by Trustee Bear that the Board Approve Adoption of Resolution No. 10, Series 2020, Entitled, "A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE TOWN OF FAIRPLAY, COLORADO, APPROVING A CHARGING STATION LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN AND CHARGEPOINT INC., FOR THE INSTALLATION OF ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION AT THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS 901 MAIN STREET."?

Brown also stated that the Town is in the second phase of the Water Study.

Assistant Town Administrator, Mason Green – Mentioned that he is working with Public Works Director, Jim Brown, Attorney, Paul Wisor, and Chief of Police, Marcus Woodward, on creating internal policies to keep everyone safe in response to COVID-19.

The low bidder was a combination of Betone Civil Constructors and Pavement Maintenance Services, Inc for \$197,097.19 When you combine this with the other work for the monument sign, we are currently at \$376,781 or \$23,219 below our budget (Town and DOLA Grant) of \$400,000.

I recommend awarding the Town Parking Lot and Access Road Project to Betone Civil Constructors with a maximum initial contract value of \$162,097.19 and to Pavement Maintenance Services, Inc. with a maximum initial contract value of \$35,000 (final negotiations and quantities will make PMS amount less).

MEMORANDUM

RE: Discussion Regarding Summer Events/Burro Days

DATE: April 16, 2020

With the ongoing COVID-19 crisis and the lack of certainty it presents for our summer season, staff felt it was important that we have a conversation with the Board about the status of these events, namely Burro Days. Other communities are also feeling this uncertainty. In our research, Leadville has canceled Boom Days (this is part of the triple crown and is held after Burro Days). Buena Vista is similarly considering canceling their leg of the race and associated events. Currently what I am hearing is that most organizers/towns/chambers/etc. are canceling events that are within 90 days. Some are tentatively planning smaller community events in place of their larger events with the option of canceling later if necessary.

Burro Days participants, such as vendors and racers, have started to reach out to staff as they see other events being affected by COVID-19. To date we have had several vendors cancel, we are not having any vendors sign-up (understandably), and all Saturday llama events have been canceled by the Rocky Mountain Llama Association (the llama race, llama rama, etc.).

Our smaller community-based events, such as the TGIFairplay Concert series do not have the same logistics and finances associated with them as Burro Days, hence we are less concerned with an early decision regarding those events.

At this point, given the information that we have, the already received vendor and other cancellations related to the event, and the fact that Leadville has canceled and Buena Vista is considering the same, staff is recommending that the Board consider postponing the 72nd Annual Burro Days to July of 2021.

The other events we are interested in discussing are Town Clean-up and the Cemetery Clean-up. These events put our staff, in particular Public Works and our volunteers, in direct contact with the public. In considering CDC and State guidelines, this interaction may not be appropriate at this time.
