# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE FAIRPLAY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

May 4, 2020

### CALL TO ORDER REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Town of Fairplay was called to order at 6:07 p.m. and was held virtually via GotoWebinar. Mayor Frank Just proceeded with the pledge of allegiance, followed by the roll call which was answered by Trustees Scott Dodge, Eve Stapp and Cindy Bear and Josh Voorhis. Also in attendance were Town Administrator/Clerk Tina Darrah and Assistant Town Administrator Mason Green.

#### **AGENDA ADOPTION**

**Motion #1** by Trustee Dodge, seconded by Trustee Bear, that the agenda be adopted. Motion carried unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA (The Consent Agenda is intended to allow the Board to spend its time on more complex items. These items are generally perceived as non-controversial and can be approved by a single motion. The public or the Board Members may ask that an item be removed from the Consent Agenda for individual consideration.)

- A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES April 20, 2020
- **B.** APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES Approval of bills of various Town Funds in the amount of \$23,285.90

**Motion #2** by Trustee Dodge, seconded by Trustee Stapp, that the Consent Agenda be adopted as presented. A roll call vote was taken: Dodge - aye, Just - aye, Stapp - aye, Voorhis—aye, Bear - aye. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **CITIZEN COMMENTS**

Town Administrator Darrah read into the record a citizen comment provided by James Dean, owner of Prathers Market, in which Mr. Dean expressed his concern regarding visitors and community members choosing not to wear masks in local businesses. He requested that the Board pass an Ordinance requiring people to wear masks in Town. Ms. Darrah also informed the Board that she had spoken with Town Attorney Paul Wisor who stated the Town of Fairplay could legally issue such an ordinance.

After a brief discussion the Board instructed staff to bring such an ordinance for Board discussion/approval at the next meeting.

Assistant Town Administrator Green informed the Board that he had spoken with Garrison Genschorck, candidate for Park County Commissioner who expressed interest in giving citizen comment. However, Green had not received a message from Mr. Genschorck prior to the meeting and, as Mr. Genschorck was not in attendance, he would not be offering a citizen comment.

No unfinished business and no other discussion items were offered.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Discussion Regarding Summer Events

Town Administrator Darrah introduced the topic by reminding the Board that they had requested to wait to make any decisions regarding summer events at the April 20<sup>th</sup> meeting until this meeting in case of new orders/information from the Federal and/or State Governments. Town Administrator Darrah then stated that it was staff's recommendation that the Board direct staff to cancel the majority of the Town's summer events including Burro Days, Plein Air, the Independence Day Celebration and others.

Mayor Just informed those present that the Board was needing to make a decision regarding holding Town Events this summer in light of the impact from COVID-19. Mayor Just then listed the events which would be discussed.

There was a brief discussion regarding whether or not the Town should hold Town Events. The decision was made in consensus that the public health risks were too great to hold summer events.

There was a brief discussion surrounding non Town owned and operated events in regards to allowing them to be held. It was determined that the Town would evaluate each event based on a public health plan created by the organizers. If said plan met County, State and Federal public health requirements the Town may allow certain non Town owned and operated events to occur.

**Motion #3** by Mayor Just, seconded by Trustee Stapp, that Town owned and operated events be cancelled as recommended by staff via the April 30<sup>th</sup> memo included in the packet. A roll call vote was taken: Dodge - aye, Just – aye, Stapp – aye, Voorhis—aye, Bear – aye. Motion carried unanimously.

#### Other New Business

#### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND STAFF REPORTS**

**Trustee, Scott Dodge-** Asked staff to put up an American Flag at the cemetery and stated he is planning to pick up garbage in the area. Lastly Mayor Pro Tem Dodge thanked Prathers and Park County for their safety efforts. He also asked staff if there was a way to sell gold panning permits online. Assistant Town Administrator Green informed the Board that this would become a reality this week.

**Trustee, Cindy Bear-** Thanked the Town for helping to celebrate the graduating seniors and echoed thanks to Prathers for their safety precautions.

**Mayor, Frank Just-** Advocated that citizens show appreciation to our businesses for the safety precautions they are taking then spoke about the historic fire truck that was donated to the Town by the Northwest Fire Department.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

Mayor Just, noting that there being no further business before the Board, declared that the meeting be adjourned at 6:50 p.m.

### **MEMORANDUM**

**RE:** Discussion Regarding Emergency Ordinance Requiring Face Coverings

**DATE:** May 14, 2020

At the last Board of Trustees meeting, a citizen comment was offered by James Dean, the owner of Prather's Grocery Store, asking the Board to consider adopting an Emergency Ordinance requiring the wearing of face coverings/face masks in public places in Fairplay. The Board directed staff to research the request and bring back an emergency ordinance for consideration/discussion. Town Attorney Paul Wisor drafted the included ordinance for that purpose.

Many communities in Colorado have considered similar ordinances, with several adopting them. Many communities have decided not to adopt these types of ordinances preferring instead to allow businesses to determine whether or not they want to require the wearing of face coverings by their customers. Note that businesses have the right to require their customers wear a face covering currently, without adoption of this ordinance.

Communities that have adopted these types of ordinances are generally using them as a public education tool — not issuing tickets but offering a reminder and an explanation as to the reason for the requirement. Businesses can also use it as a fall back — "it is required by law…".

I am sure you have heard arguments for both sides of this issue. This is purely a policy decision by the Board and staff does not have a recommendation – we are happy to comply with the decision made by the Board.

### TOWN OF FAIRPLAY, COLORADO ORDINANCE #2 (SERIES 2020)

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE TOWN OF FAIRPLAY, COLORADO, REQUIRING THE WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS IN PLACES OF PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION WITHIN THE TOWN.

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a highly contagious virus that has spread throughout the United States and the Town of Fairplay, Colorado (the "Town"); and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 causes serious illness and death, especially to elderly persons or those with underlying health conditions; and

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19 a "public health emergency of international concern"; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services declared COVID-19 a public health emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 10, 2020, in response to the spread of COVID-19, Governor Jared Polis declared a state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, Park County, Colorado declared a local disaster; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Town Administrator of the Town of Fairplay, pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-33.5-709(1), declared a local disaster emergency in and for the Town of Fairplay (the "Emergency Declaration"); and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2020-11 the Board of Trustees of the Town of Fairplay ratified the Emergency Declaration and extended the Emergency Declaration until the Board of Trustees terminates such declaration; and

WHEREAS, after a month of Coloradans complying with an order requiring most people to stay at home, Governor Polis issued Executive Order D2020-044 on April 26, 2020, which introduced the "Safer at Home" phase of slightly relaxed regulation and permitted some noncritical businesses to open with certain restrictions on May 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, in the Safer at Home order, Governor Polis provided that nothing in such order prevents a county or municipality from adopting more protective standards than those contained in the order, including but not limited to stay at home orders, mask wearing requirements in public, or additional protective measures and, if such local measures are adopted, they will become effective within the county or municipality without state approval; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (the "CDC") recommends the wearing of cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain and further recommends the use of simple cloth face coverings to slow the spread of COVID-19 and the Colorado Department of Public Health; and

WHEREAS, due to the relaxed regulations contained in the Safer at Home Order and the recommendations of the CDC, the Board of Trustees has determined that to protect the public health, safety and welfare, it is in the best interests of the Town and its citizens to adopt new regulations requiring face coverings to be worn in places of public accommodation within the town temporarily; and

WHEREAS, the face coverings required by this Ordinance are not surgical masks or N95 respirators, which are critical supplies that must continue to be reserved for healthcare workers and first responders, as recommended by current CDC guidance.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Fairplay, Colorado that:

- <u>Section 1.</u> <u>Definitions.</u> For purposes of this Ordinance, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:
- A. Face covering shall mean a uniform piece of cloth or other similar material that fits snugly but comfortably against the side of the face and covers the nose and mouth.
- B. Place of public accommodation means a place of business that is open to the public, including, but not limited to, offices, retail stores, and facilities where government services may be accessed.

### <u>Section 2.</u> <u>Face Coverings Required.</u> It shall be unlawful:

- A. For any person to enter a place of public accommodation without wearing a face covering.
- B. For any person who owns, or who is in responsible control of, a place of public accommodation to allow or permit to remain within such place of public accommodation any person who is not wearing a face covering.
- Section 3. Exceptions. Nothing herein shall require the wearing of face coverings by the following:
- A. Children under the age of two (2) years old, except in child care environments, and children of any age while napping;
- B. Persons who have trouble breathing; a person who is unconscious, incapacitated, or is otherwise unable to remove the face covering without assistance; or persons for whom a face covering would cause impairment due to an existing health condition;

C. Persons working in a professional office who do not have any face-to-face interactions with the public; provided, however, if such office is located within a building containing one or more other offices or places of public accommodation, face coverings shall be worn when entering and exiting such building and may only be removed once within the professional office where such person works; and

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- D. Persons in restaurants that are permitted by state and county regulations to serve food for consumption on the premises, while such person is in the act of eating or drinking; provided, however, that face coverings must be worn while entering and exiting the restaurant, while ordering, paying, or otherwise interacting with employees or other customers of the restaurant, and once the food and drink have been consumed.
- E. First responders, including police officers, firefighters, and emergency medical technicians, when use of a face covering would interfere with their ability to perform their respective duties or would prevent clear communications regarding enforcement actions or direction and when talking on the radio.
- Section 4. Required Signage. All places of public accommodation shall display at each entrance a sign advising all persons of the requirements of this Ordinance, and that it is unlawful to enter such place of public accommodation without a required face covering.
- <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Violations; Penalty.</u> Any person charged with a violation of this Ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to the General Penalty laid out in Section 1-4-20 of the Fairplay Municipal Code, which provides for imprisonment for a period not to exceed one year, a fine not to exceed two thousand six hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,650.00), or both such fine and imprisonment.
- Section 6. <u>Violations: License Suspension or Revocation.</u> In addition to the penalties provided in Section 1-4-20 of the Fairplay Municipal Code, a violation of this Ordinance may be cause for suspension or revocation of any license issued by the Town following notice and hearing before the applicable licensing authority.
- <u>Section 7.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and shall continue in effect until terminated by the Board of Trustees.
- <u>Section 8.</u> <u>More Restrictive Requirements Control.</u> To the extent any federal, state, or county regulations, orders, or laws are enacted that are more restrictive than the requirements of this Ordinance, the more restrictive regulations, orders, or laws shall control.
- Section 9. Provisions Severable. If any portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each part hereof irrespective of the fact that any one part be declared invalid.
- Section 10. All other ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent or conflicting with this ordinance or any portion hereof are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.
